### News from Sanctuary Outpost

Greetings! This is the month we celebrate Thanksgiving both in Canada and the US. Isn't it wonderful that we have a God who cares for us so supremely? (Matthew 10:29-31)

October has been eventful in many different ways for Sally and myself. I began the month in the U.S. Virgin Islands learning about ministry opportunities on the islands of St. John and St. Thomas. There is no unified response preparedness for weather related disaster in the U.S. Virgin Island system. I was included in the first meetings to form disaster relief teams. Training is scheduled for December/2015 for both debris removal and mass feeding. We at CRMI are working to facilitate some of that for the Fresh Water Church team on St. John. We are also searching for funds to provide such things such as emergency generators, EMT training, and the wherewithal necessary to provide for people in crisis. There is a 100 percent certainty that there will be a weather related event in these islands. The last major hurricane in these islands was twenty years ago and the clock is ticking. Many new ministry opportunities are emerging in the Caribbean Basin and we as a mission are gearing up to assist in those areas. I will keep you updated as we go forward.
